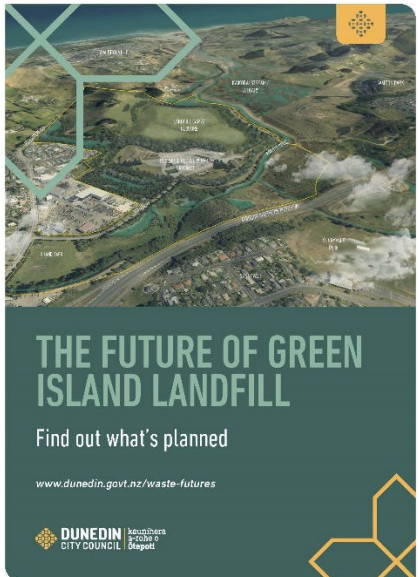

## WHAT'S PLANNED FOR GREEN ISLAND LANDFILL?

As part of our Waste Futures programme of projects and Dunedin's wider commitment to reducing carbon emissions and reducing waste going to landfill, we will be making changes to the use of Green Island landfill site in coming years.

### Staged closure of the landfill

Based on Dunedin's current waste disposal rates, we expect that the Green Island landfill can keep taking our city's waste until about 2029. Between now and then, and as it continues to fill up, the landfill will be closed and capped in stages.



As current Otago Regional Council resource consents needed to operate a landfill at Green Island expire in October 2023, we are applying for replacement consents to continue to use the landfill until it closes completely.

### A new resource recovery park

A state-of-the-art resource recovery park to support a new kerbside bin collection service for the city is also planned for the site. Improvements will include new facilities to better process recyclable material and the kitchen and garden waste collected in the new bins.

### Future opportunities

After the landfill has closed, opportunities could open up for recreational and environmental improvements in the area around it. Examples could include new public walking and biking tracks beside the Kaikorai Estuary. We'll talk to you more about these ideas in the future.

GREEN ISLAND LANDFILL SITE: TODAY

**WHAT'S PLANNED AND WHY?**

As part of our Waste Future programme of projects and Dunedin's wider commitment to reducing carbon emissions and reducing waste going to landfill, we're planning changes to the use of Green Island landfill site in the coming years.

These changes include:

- Staged closure of the landfill itself over the next six years based on current waste disposal plans.
- A new table-top recreation facility park to support a new kerbside collection service for the city.

**A NEW KERBSIDE COLLECTION SERVICE FOR DUNEDIN**

We're looking to introduce the new kerbside collection service in April 2023.

**WHAT ARE WE DOING NOW?**

**PAST**

Over 100 years of the engineering and construction of the landfill for the city.

**PRESENT**

Phase 1 of the closure of the landfill site, with the first stage of the new kerbside collection service in April 2023.

**UTURE**

Phase 2 of the closure of the landfill site, with the second stage of the new kerbside collection service in April 2023.

**PLANNING CONTEXT**

GREEN ISLAND LANDFILL SITE: POST CLOSURE

**FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES**

While the landfill closure, opportunities could arise for public recreational use to be provided. Examples could be walking and cycling tracks, a dog park, a library, a museum, a community centre and a park for environmental education. We'll look for you when it comes to these opportunities in the future.

**CURRENT**

**WHAT IT COULD BE**

**EDUCATION**

Integration and activation of the site into the history of the site and the wider environment, such as a park or walking track, and how it has changed over time.

**ENVIRONMENT**

Enhance the environment by planting native and exotic flora and fauna, and adding to the ecological value of the site, such as the native birdlife.

**WALKING AND CYCLING**

Connect local communities through new paths and routes around the edge of the site, such as the new walking track.

**RECREATION**

Provide a space for recreational use, such as a dog park, a library, a museum, a community centre and a park for environmental education.
