

My name is Colin Verables

Our family farm is at 190 Brighton Rd

It's situated about 1 Km from the  
Landfill in a South Easterly  
direction.

I am making this submission on

behalf of myself,

My wife and two sons, who have

properties on the East side of

our farm adjoining Blackhead Read.

For some years now I have

been complaining on a regular

Basis to the Landfill Operations

management.

In the past this was

Paul Withers, before him

various people.

As it seemed to me at the

time odours were continuing

to drift over our property, so

when Paul left, I have been

calling the ORC Pollution Department,

mainly from the end of 2023

till now.

The reason we are making this

Submission is because we

missed an opportunity to submit

on the recent Application by

the DCC to have approved

the new green waste facility

(3)

at this site.

On reading reports in the O.D.T.

of these proceedings we were

astounded to hear that the

Landfill has had very few

complaints about Odour

problems in the last five or six

years.

I seem to recall the number was

less than 10.

This statement was incredible to us,

as we had made numerous calls

to the Landfill management.

Sometimes twice or three times

a week and they spoke of

(4)

trying to overcome odour problems by installing Scent Cannons which failed on occasions and other efforts which would minimise bad odours.

The main problems I've found out were when the Landfill dug trenches to bury hardcake coming from the Tahuna Water Treatment Plant which on occasions had problems disposing of this material due to break downs at that plant.

I was informed of this situation by a staff member

at the Tahuna Facility, so when I spoke to the Green Island Landfill manager he agreed that they were covering these trenches more quickly to minimise odour.

I was informed numerous times that my complaints were being logged and they were doing their best to minimise the odours, this was obviously not happening.

These odours drift over to our properties when the wind conditions are mainly from a Norwest direction; <sup>Generally</sup> ~~mainly~~ when there is a wafting breeze from that direction.

Over the years this has been  
the mornings, but other times  
late afternoon, and the  
problem is that the smell  
goes and comes back and when  
we have been visited by ORC  
staff, often the smell has  
gone.

Normally I usually wait at  
least 10 minutes of constant  
odour before I contact the  
ORC.

These smells are from an  
intense dead fish odour to  
earthy type smells when they

are processing at the landfill.  
They are often vile and we have  
to close house windows and exit  
our yard when they arrive.  
In the last 6 months odours seem  
to be less over the months but  
as we are not always about we  
may miss them.

We have this year starting noting  
down odour times

For example:- 4/3/25 8.30 am Dead fish  
smell. 9.20 am another  
5 minutes of bad  
odours.

17/03  
Last Night 5.30 PM  
My Son Smelt the landfill  
on the Strait below our place

10/3/25 My daughter-in law  
rang to say the odour  
was intense in the  
morning -

Their house is up the hill above our house. We were out so did not smell it.

I note in the councils submission there is a statement, a condition on the operation of the present Landfill should be no offensive noxious dangerous or objectionable odours at or beyond the boundary to the extent it causes adverse effects.

Up until now the DCC have failed in this endeavour despite

that this is already a condition in existing Resource Consents.

What is going to change!!! ?

Whilst we understand the reasons the D.C.C. wish to continue operations at the present site until 2030 and the very substantial cost to Rate payers to close it early then we do not object to its continuance, however they need to substantially improve the odour situation so all neighbours of this site, do not have to put up with objectionable smells

emanating from this  
operation.
