- The Royal Forest and Bird Protection Society of New Zealand Incorporated (Forest & Bird) wishes to be a party to the following proceedings:
 - a. ENV-2024-CHC-30 Cain Whānau v Otago Regional Council
- Forest & Bird made a submission and further submission on the Proposed Otago Regional Policy Statement.
- 3. Forest & Bird is not a trade competitor for the purposes of section 308C or 308CA of the Resource Management Act 1991.
- 4. Forest & Bird has an interest greater than the public generally as an incorporated society with a well-known role in the protection of indigenous biodiversity.¹
- 5. Forest & Bird is interested in the proceeding insofar as it concerns:
 - a. MW-P4 and the relief seeking to remove clause 2 and insert the drafting, including and along the lines of: "To avoid any doubt in the case of an actual or potential conflict with any other provision(s) in this PORPS, MW-P4 shall take priority."
 - b. MW-M5(4).
- 6. Forest & Bird **partially opposes** the relief. In particular, where it may conflict with provisions containing environmental bottom lines supported by Forest & Bird or where Forest & Bird has sought relief seeking clearer environmental bottom lines. The amendments sought are broad and could have broad ranging adverse effects on indigenous biodiversity values.
- 7. Forest & Bird agrees to participate in mediation or other alternative dispute resolution of the proceeding.
