Kia ora,

Welcome to the March issue of ORC's Freshwater farm plans (FWFP) newsletter.

An update from the Government

The regulations remain in effect however the coalition Government has signaled their intention to improve freshwater farm plans to ensure they are cost effective and realistic for farmers.

In the meantime, Government has advised we continue with work as per the current system, until they make a further announcement. We now expect to have more information in April.

Implementation of the freshwater farm plan roll out by regional and unitary councils has been going well. We are now working through what implementation looks like in our region and will be in touch as soon as we know more.

We will continue to keep a close eye on any updates from central government, advocate for the needs of our region, work through what any changes mean for us locally, and keep you informed.

Assessor training event

The first assessor training for Otago was held on February 28th. A morning session was held at Karitane Hall with the afternoon spent on a nearby farm.

Three potential assessors for Otago attended the training as well as some staff from Otago Regional Council, Environment Southland, and potential certifiers for Southland too.

A Ministry for the Environment staff member was in attendance to provide some context and there was also a presentation from mana whenua representatives.

The assessors for the region will have a crucial role to play in ensuring we have certifiers within Otago who know farming systems, have the capability to work with farmers, and who will also support achieving the desired environmental outcomes of FWFPs.

Regional training programme

Regional training for farm certifiers began in March and includes the following online modules:

- Otago context
- Intensive Winter Grazing (IWG)
- Dairy effluent
- Otago science
- Waterways and wetlands

After completing the online modules, there will be an in-person component of the regional training which will need to be attended.

This first in-person session will be run in April/May 2024, with the date confirmed once we have an update from the Government on the regulations.

Lower Clutha next to rollout

Farmers and growers in the Lower Clutha <u>Freshwater Management Unit (FMU)</u>, will have new freshwater regulations activated on the 1st of August 2024.

The following land uses will require a freshwater farm plan to be developed, and these need to be completed and certified within 18 months of the above date:

- 20 hectares or more in arable or pastoral use
- 5 hectares or more in horticultural use
- 20 hectares or more of combined use
